

Profiles: Current and Past Presidents

Current IMANE President Nasir A. Khan, MD, is the Chairman and CEO of Bournewood Health Systems in Brookline, MA and has a private clinical group practice in Newton. He was born in London to parents from Rampur, U.P., and attended the University of London's King's College and Westminster Medical School and then completed a residency at the Harvard Department of Psychiatry at Boston City Hospital.

Dr. Khan is a past Superintendant of Danvers State Hospital, past President of the Medical Staff of Newton Wellesley Hospital, past President of the Massachusetts Association of Behavioral Health Systems, past Trustee of the National Association of Psychiatric Health Systems, past President of the Charles River District Medical Society and currently a Trustee (alternate) to the Massachusetts Medical Society.

He is certified by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology with additional qualifications in geriatric psychiatry and he is an alumnus of the OPM Program of Harvard Business School. He is also a Distinguished Life Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association, Assistant Clinical Professor in Psychiatry at Tufts University School of Medicine and Adjunct Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at the Boston University School of Medicine.

IMANE Past President Manorama Mathur, MD, obtained her medical degree from King George's Medical College in Lucknow, India. She received her post graduate medical training in pediatrics at the University of Lucknow and earned a Diploma in Child Health from the University of London, England. She was also a Senior Registrar at the Whittington Hospital in London. She completed her Residency in Pediatrics from Children's Hospital Medical Center and Boston City Hospital. She is board certified by the American Academy of Pediatrics and is a Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Dr. Mathur has had a private pediatric practice in Malden for almost 30 years.
