From the President's Desk

Dear IMANE family,

As we contend with the deficit, MMS has presented an amended contract of \$28,885.00 per annum. Some select members with negotiating skills accompanied me to a meeting with the MMS to renegotiate the contract, as IMANE cannot afford to pay the annual fee with an incremental increase of 5% each year, especially with a dwindling membership. We are still waiting for the amended contract. I will keep you posted.

With that said, I look forward to working with each and every one of you. I encourage you to call me with any questions or concerns, and I look forward to hearing your ideas!

Doctors for America is a national movement of more than 16,000 physicians and medical students in all 50 states working together to improve the health of the nation and to ensure that everyone has access to affordable, high quality health care. The organization was started by Boston physicians 5 years ago and has always had strong leadership from Massachusetts. The organization is led by Co-founder Vivek Murthy who was recently nominated by President Obama for Surgeon General. The success of the organization has allowed the state of Massachusetts to have near universal health coverage.

A special evening was hosted by Doctors for America and Drs. Sean and Judy Palfrey, House Masters of Adams House at Harvard University. The evening included chamber music by members of the Longwood Symphony Orchestra and an opportunity to hear from Dr. Vivek Murthy. The fundraiser helped to raise over 10,000 dollars to help connect 5000 people around the country with health insurance.
